KRISTI KIM—Cello Soloist

Kristi Kim, a seventh grader at Bert Lynn Middle School, has studied cello just three and a half years with Dorothy Muggeridge, and has already participated in many competitions and accumulated many awards and accolades. She has won several prizes at the Southwestern Youth Music Festival, and in 2010 won third place at the American String Teachers Association L.A. finals. Last year, Kristi was one of the two recipients of the annual Beach Cities Symphony Scholarships awarded to Middle School students. That same year, she won Grand Prize






at the Korean Times Competition and the Cello Award at the M.T.A.C. Scholarship Audition. In March, 2012, Kristi played at Walt Disney Concert Hall as part of the mass cello ensemble at the closing concert of the Piatigorsky International Cello Festival. Most recently, she won the South Bay VOCE (Vocalists, Orchestral instruments, and Chamber Ensembles) competition and will be advancing to state finals. Kristi is an active member of the Palos Verdes Regional Symphony Orchestra and plays in a trio with two flutists.

Erica Mineo began her piano studies at age seven





with Soh-Rah Kim. Since 2007, she has been a student of Dr. Linda Govel. Now a 13-year-old seventh grader, Erica is also an accomplished violinist, studying with Gail Gerding Mellert. Her awards in piano competitions include the Bellflower Concerto Competition, Bach Complete Works Audition, Southwestern Youth Music Festival Auditions, and Music Teachers Association **Junior** and **Intermediate** Division Scholarships. Erica has taken master classes with Lucille Straub and composer Dr. David Ward-Steinman. She has also had sessions with Bernadene Blaha at the USC Thornton School of Music. Erica is currently Associate Principal

Second Violinist in the Asia America Youth Orchestra, under the direction of David Benoit. She enjoys Tae Kwon Do, Cotillion, and volunteering with Helga's Cat Rescue and Adoption Program.

Now at age 13, and an eighth grade student at Ridgecrest Elementary School in Palos Verdes, she is an honor roll student and has already acquired 18 awards (16 first places) in the Open Category of the Southwestern Youth Music Festival. Her many awards include first place in the Greater Los Angeles American String Teachers Association Competition in 2009, an M.T.A.C. Scholarship Audition award in 2011, and first place in the South Bay Branch M.T.A.C. VOCE State Finals Competition, advancing to the state finals in both 2011 and 2012. Karen has performed with the Bellflower Symphony and the Palos Verdes Regional Symphony Orchestra, and is an active member of the first violin section in the Palos Verdes Regional Symphony Orchestra.

SUSAN WANG — Piano Soloist

Rhapsody on a Theme of Paganini—Sergei Rachmaninoff. Born in New Zealand, Susan Wang began her studies at age seven while living in Japan. She moved to the United States with her family in 2004 and is now a sophomore at Chadwick High School. Susan is a student of Anli Lin Tong and has garnered many prizes and awards, including Gold Medal at Southern California Bach Festival Complete Works, L.A. International Liszt Competition, M.T.A.C. Scholarship Auditions in 2007 and 2009. Susan won the Edith Knox Most Outstanding Pianist Award and was a finalist in the Edith Knox Concerto Competition. She has also performed in Austria and Japan. In 2010, as part of a chamber music piano quartet, Susan performed at the Colburn School. She is a recipient of many awards in art, writing, and math and is an active member of cross-country, Model United Nations, and American Red Cross Youth.
